 What was the social structure of England in the period 1200 to 1500? What were the basic forms of social inequality? To what extent did such divisions

generate social conflict? How significantly did English society change during this period and what were the causes of social change? What does modern social theory have to offer the historian seeking to understand English society in the later middle
