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**'Other' Spanish Theatres** Vintage  
A 1944 existentialist French play by Jean-Paul Sartre. The play was first performed at the Théâtre du Vieux-Colombier in May 1944. The play begins with three characters who find themselves waiting in a mysterious room. It is a depiction of the afterlife in which three deceased characters are punished by being locked into a room together for eternity. It is the source of Sartre's especially famous phrase

"L'enfer, c'est les autres" or "Hell is other people", a reference to Sartre's ideas about the look and the perpetual ontological struggle of being caused to see oneself as an object from the view of another consciousness.

The Object of the Atlantic is a wide-ranging study of the transition from a concern with sovereignty to a concern with things in Iberian Atlantic literature and art produced between 1868 and 1968. pero finalmente (conforme su conexión con Tierra se desvanece y los vivos prosiguen) son abandonados con sus propios pensamientos y la compañía de los otros dos. Al final de la obra, Garcín exige salir; tras decirlo, la puerta se abre, pero ninguno decide salir, ya que se dan cuenta de que no pueden vivir los unos sin los otros.
