In 2016, award-winning Minnesota-based photographer R. J. Kern made portraits of youth contestants at Minnesota county fairs. Each participant—some as young as four years old—had spent a year raising an animal, which they had then entered into a 4-H livestock competition. None of the youths who sat for him had succeeded in

winning an award, despite the obvious care they had given to their animals. The *Unchosen Ones* depicts the bloom of youth and the mettle of the kids who grow up on farms, reminding us how resilient children can be when confronted with life's inevitable disappointments. The formal qualities of the lighting and setting endow these young people with a gravitas beyond their years, revealing self-directed dedication in some, and in others, perhaps, the pressures of traditions imposed upon them. Kern's beautiful portraits capture a particular America, a rural world, and a time in life when the layered emotions of youth are laid bare. Four years later, in 2020, Kern returned to photograph his young subjects. The most recent photographs show how the children have grown into adolescence or young adulthood: some of them have continued to pursue animal husbandry, while others have developed other interests. It is likely that some of these kids will not choose to continue running their family farms—an unpredictable and demanding way to make a living. These diptychs are punctuated by lush landscapes of the farms that are their homes. As Kern made

the second group of photographs, he asked his young subjects what they had carried forward from their previous experience. What were their thoughts, their dreams, and their goals for the future? How would they fit into the future of agricultural America?

Finnish photographer Riitta Pivinen's work could be defined as the emotional archaeology of the ordinary. Using old clothes she finds in second-hand shops and flea markets, Pivinen creates landscapes and photographs them. The garments represent both the presence and the absence of their former owners.

The Berlin-based Finnish artist Ola Kolehmainen composes his photographs according to strict principles of order, showing rows of repetitive basic patterns of symmetrical constructs. Generally featuring sections of facades, the Minimalist austerity of these images is

occasionally broken by elements, such as trees or other buildings mirrored in the facades, that circumvent this formalism. Kolehmainen's works are produced using the Diasac process, which means that the environment is reflected on the surface of the photos as well as in the images themselves - a calculated component of his work.

Following the first four volumes of *The Helsinki School*, this new publication looks back at the development of this group of photographers over the past twenty years and traces the emergence of the gallery and photographic tendency bearing this name. In a collection of essays international curators, art critics, and museum directors describe their encounters with the Helsinki School, from the first exhibitions in the late nineties to the youngest generation of photographers. A discussion between Timothy Persons and Alistair Hicks concludes these contributions. The texts are accompanied

by installation shots from numerous international exhibitions, archival materials, books, posters, invitations, and most recent works by the different generations of artists. Denn schöner als in diesen Aufnahmen lassen sich Vögel kaum darstellen. *The Helsinki School* Hatje Cantz Verlag Exhibition theme: The subject of 2010 Daegu Biennale is 'tru(E)motion' (landscape calling us). It has three points of view. First, it is literally true emotion. A photographer expresses his/her emotion sincerely in a situation that happens in a space through photos. Second, it can show motions through 'true motion.' it shows the boundary between photos and videos through video works of photo artists as well as photos. It stimulates audience's curiosity through various instruments for video works. Last, 'E' expresses the nature and the human which are great interests in the field of art, as the initial 'e' of ecology and environment. So, it views a subtle relation between cities made by

humans and the humans living in the cities ironically. Moreover, it is a complex keyword of three main exhibitions ('Seconds of Life': landscape made by humans, 'helsinki school' and 'breaking the edge') which are introduced in this Biennale.

Helsinki is the chosen site for the Guggenheim Museum's latest effort to replicate the much-contested 'Bilbao Effect.' Advocates of better methods for fusing the arts and urbanism combined to launch an alternative design competition in 2015. 'The Next Helsinki' helped to amplify a public debate about the role of culture in civic health and economic development that has consequences far beyond the Finnish case-study. In addition to cataloging the hundreds of entries from dozens of countries, this volume includes essays by leading urbanists, artists, and architects about the significance of the competition and the principles that inspired it.
