Packed with more than 500 photos, *All the Songs* is also filled with stories fans treasure, such as Waters working with engineer Alan Parsons to employ revolutionary recording techniques for *The Dark Side of the Moon* at Abbey Road Studios in 1972 or producer Bob Ezrin's contribution in refining Water's original sprawling vision for *The Wall*.

Syd Barrett was an English composer and purveyor of some of the most intriguing music ever written. With a Fender Telecaster and a primitive Binson echo unit, Barrett liberated the guitar from being, in critic Simon Reynolds' words, 'a riff machine, and turned it into a texture and timbre generator.'
