The Assembly of 1920 enacted much constructive school legislation. Since the Constitutional Convention a large body of school laws and regulations have been passed. School officials have been confused oftentimes not merely by the number of these statutes but by the fact

that the import of some of them seemed obscure. The last Assembly, therefore, repealed certain laws, revised and simplified others and passed a number of new and constructive measures. It seems necessary at this time to present a new Code of the school laws. The Constitutional provisions are re-arranged in logical order. The three proposed amendments to be presently voted upon are printed immediately following the sections to be amended. 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Excerpt from Virginia School Report: Biennial Report of the Superintendent of Public Instruction of the Commonwealth of Virginia, With Accompanying Documents; School Years 1905-1906 and 1906-1907 In submitting the biennial report for the two years beginning August 1, 1905, and ending July 31, 1907, it seems pertinent to examine the actual statistics, first of all, and inquire

what the figures have to say. It will be seen that the arrangement of the tables is undergoing a gradual process of change and that those of the two years given herein agree neither in order of sequence nor in content. The unit of practical administration in Virginia is the district and not the county. The statistics of a county may seem altogether encouraging, when the facts are that two excellent districts have produced an average which disguises the real condition of two other districts needing immediate attention and heroic treatment. This department, therefore, has given the data for 1906 - 1907 by districts to as great an extent as limited time and the present administrative machinery would permit. In this respect we have returned to the custom established and used by Dr. William H. Ruffner, Virginia's first and greatest superintendent of public instruction. Certain tables giving the school population, enrolment, average attendance, etc., from the inauguration of the public school system, which have been published from year to year have been completed and revised to date (see pages 93 These tables disclose a gradual enlargement of public school interests in all respects except in the two which are of most importance; namely, length of term and teachers' salaries. If, therefore, our demands for money seem to be making colossal strides. We must remember that it will take three-league boots to put Virginia among the leading States, so far as salaries and length of term are concerned, in any reasonable length of time. The Legislature of 1906 appreciated this fact keenly and bravely took occasion by the hand; indications that the Legislature of 1908 will continue the policy of its predecessor are by no means wanting and the spirit of our

This publication, resulting from a survey of more than 2,000 school districts, focuses on school violence and ways to prevent it. Section 1 discusses both the problem of school violence and also the critical role that school boards must play in keeping schools safe. Section 2 includes brief descriptions of the more than 700 violence prevention programs used by school districts. Excerpt from Virginia School Laws: Codified for the Use of School Officers by Order of the State Board of Education; To Be Preserved by Each Officer and Delivered to His Successor While this edition of the school law possesses no authority independent of the sources from which it was compiled, its publication by the Board of Education makes the work authoritative as a guide to school officers. The act of Assembly which gave the school system organic life was approved July 11, 1870. The history of subsequent legislation affecting the schools can be readily traced from chapters LXVI and LXVII of the Codes of Virginia 1887 and 1904, which constitute the basis of the "Public Free School Law." The text of Pollard's Code of 1904 has been followed, except

in so far as it has been modified by legislation since its publication. Acts of Assembly passed subsequent to that date (1904) are incorporated with the original law. All acts of a local character are omitted, and only such acts pertaining to State institutions of higher learning have been included as are of interest to the school officials at large. The compiler has endeavored to arrange the matter for the convenience of school officers, without regard to the order in which it is printed in the Code. It is the duty of every school officer receiving a copy of the law to preserve it carefully, and to transmit it to his successor in office.
